
2 Bringing Indian Ethical Practices to the World

WHAT IS AI STANDARD.IO?



The initiative intends to establish a consortium of AI entities in India, Asia and the Global South, to develop market-friendly AI standards, with sector-specific, and sector-neutral contexts.

The standards could be legal, economic, ethical, or purely policy-based. They could be limited to - let's say - things like - HR policy, or knowledge management, or cybersecurity, or the use of specific classes of fourth party AI tools.



IS IT A FORM OF REGULATORY CAPTURE? ANOTHER MARKETING FORUM? TALK SHOP?

No.

Since ISAIL is led by techno-lawyers, and ethics-friendly technical professionals as well, our aim is to utilise the AIStandard.io initiative for AI entities and help them build standards that help them grow.

Most Responsible AI discussions, and initiatives focus on risk + regulation, are hype-based or fear-based. This means many are not aware of the clear sets of risks in building any AI solutions. They unfortunately also mix the usage risks of existing AI services & products with any AI research or novel AI product / service, which creates regulatory confusion, and inconsistencies around what practices suit for the market, and what does not.

And believe us, it could be related to something as small as a tax law decision for social enterprise on AI, to compute costs & associated contractual rights to even something on access policies around multiple foundational GenAI models.



Individual Membership

Individuals who are students, and professionals in any domain can apply for ISAIL Individual Membership. They should check The Bharat Pacific Charter at isail.in/guidelines, since they are the main bye laws that govern individual membership.

That being stated, we prefer professionals, academic members, faculty members, and students in the fields of law, policy, technology (or AI/CS/ML) and management, on priority. However, multidisciplinary stakeholders, i.e., people who belong to different fields, and yet are affected by the democratisation of AI, or wish to impart a positive impact of AI technologies, are welcome to apply.

Hence, any legitimate professional / student who is not a minor can apply to become an ISAIL member.




Previous Editions of the Summit



Given the facts, and precedents and the legal provision can the death penalty be dismissed and substituted with life sentence?

Your Honor, as the plaintiff in this case, I humbly submit that the death penalty imposed on the accused should indeed be dissolved and substituted with life sentence. The arguments, as submitted by the plaintiff, are as follows: The accused is a minor in the sense that he is below the age of 18 years. The State of U.P., before the Supreme Court, held the constitutionality of the death sentence but also recognized the wide discretion of judges in the matter of fixing the degree of punishment. The court acknowledged the impossibility of laying down standards for punishment, and the role of judges to consider all facts and circumstances of each case (Page Number 32A, 333, 395).

Furthermore, in the case of Kali Sureshwaran vs. State of Andhra Pradesh, the Supreme Court reduced the death sentence to life imprisonment, taking into account the accused's young age, the incident arising out of a fit of rage, and the mitigating nature of the offence (Page Number 33A, 343). In the present case, the accused's actions, while reprehensible, were influenced by strong emotions and a complex personal history, which could be considered mitigating factors.

Additionally, the Federal Court in Pare Deoudh and Others v. The King's Counsel, has exercised its power to commute death sentences to life imprisonment due to inordinate delay in execution, recognizing the procedural safeguards and the opportunities for the accused to present his case (Page Number 216, 236). The accused in the present case has already faced a significant period of incarceration under the Trial of Offences, which should be taken into account.

Lastly, Article 21 of the Constitution of India guarantees the right to life and personal liberty, except according to the procedure established by law. The procedural safeguards and the opportunities for the accused to present his case, as mentioned above, have been provided in the Criminal Procedure Code, have been referred to in this case (Page Number 301, 302).

Therefore, considering the precedents, the constitutional provisions, and the specific circumstances of the accused, I pray that this honorable Court exercises its discretion judiciously and commutes the death sentence to life imprisonment.
